Psoriasis is one of the most common auto-immune disorders



Psoriasis affects 125 million people worldwide.1



It causes rapid build-up of extra skin cells that form thick, silvery scales and itchy, dry red patches.2

Psoriasis is often linked to other diseases. each with their own significant symptoms





Approximately 42% of patients with psoriasis may develop psoriatic arthritis (PsA) and as many as 1 in 7 people with psoriasis may have undiagnosed PsA.34



Patients with PSO and PsA are at a greater risk of developing a range of other health conditions, such as cardiovascular disease, obesity, depression and diabetes.5 Psoriasis often creates significant emotional and social burdens on patients



Nearly 60% of people with psoriasis say the disease causes problems in their everyday lives. 6

Psoriasis patients are more likely to suffer from depression.8



65% of patients have reported discrimination at work, in school and other places.7



Patients feel like outcasts, and often prefer not to be seen in public.9

Psoriasis is more than a skin disease and can have a negative impact on one's psychological and social well-being, particularly in women



A recent survey found that 30% of young women with psoriasis were affected by low self-esteem.10





Compared to young men and older women, younger women also reported higher levels of stress and loneliness. 10
